IN AN UNPRECEDENTED SUPER SEASON...

JERRY KELLY: It sure seems like a long time ago we started this season.

PAUL BROADHURST: It's been a marathon rather than a sprint.

THE IMMORTAL BERNHARD LANGER FIGHTS TO RECLAIM THE CHARLES SCHWAB CUP...

BERNHARD LANGER: Right, now I'm in the driver's seat...I'm just naturally motivated.

ANNC: Win number 42 for Bernhard Langer!

BUT A SUPER CLASS OF ROOKIES EMBRACE THEIR YOUTHFUL POWER...

ANNC: Fabulous Phil! A 3-time winner on the PGA TOUR Champions.

ANNC: Jim Furyk...trying to win the Charles Schwab Cup and unseat Bernhard Langer.

AND OTHER CRUSADERS BREAK THROUGH IN EPIC FASHION...

ANNC: Alex Cejka has won the first major of the year! The 2021 Regions Tradition!

STEVEN ALKER: You never know when you're gonna win...

ANNC: Steven Alker, a first-time winner on the PGA TOUR Champions!

STEVEN ALKER: That was just the week for me...everything kinda just fell into place.

ALL LOOKING TO BE THE HERO.

ERNIE ELS: The history of the Charles Schwab Cup speaks for itself. You've done very well when you lift that trophy.

THIS IS THE 2021 PGA TOUR CHAMPIONS YEAR IN REVIEW.

A2 – 2020 RECAP

2021 KICKED OFF IN A FAMILIAR SETTING AS A FIELD FULL OF LEGENDS LOOKED TO START THE YEAR ON THE RIGHT FOOT...

BUT IN ORDER TO TELL THE STORY OF 2021, WE NEED TO REMEMBER WHAT HAPPENED IN 2020.

ANNC: And there it is! Miguel Angel Jimenez!

ANNC: And win number 41 for Bernhard Langer!

THE PGA TOUR CHAMPIONS WAS IN FULL FORCE AT THE START OF ITS 41ST SEASON...

BUT AFTER JUST 5 EVENTS, PROFESSIONAL GOLF CAME TO A SUDDEN HAULT AS THE WORLD WENT INTO LOCKDOWN DUE TO THE SPREAD OF COVID-19.

AFTER A 20-WEEK HIATUS, THE PGA TOUR CHAMPIONS RETURNED WITH A SHORTENED SCHEDULE AND ADOPTED A WRAPAROUND SEASON TO CROWN THE CHARLES SCHWAB CUP CHAMPION IN NOVEMBER OF 2021.

DARREN CLARKE: We resumed playing again last year and the tour did an unbelievable job to give us those opportunities to go and play.

WITH JUST 10 TOURNAMENTS LEFT IN 2020, THE STORYLINES OF THE SUPERSEASON STARTED TO TAKE FORM...

ANNC: Ernie Els buried it! Wow!

ANNC: Phil Mickelson is undefeated on the PGA Tour Champions. Two starts. Two wins.

AND CAPPED OFF WITH AN EPIC BATTLE BETWEEN KEVIN SUTHERLAND AND PAUL BROADHURST.

ANNC: After nine playoff holes, Kevin Sutherland is the winner of the Charles Schwab Cup Championship.

WITH 2020 WRAPPED UP, BERNHARD LANGER HELD THE TOP SPOT ON THE CHARLES SCHWAB CUP STANDINGS WITH ROOKIE ERNIE ELS SITTING CLOSE BEHIND...AND SET UP WHAT WAS BOUND TO BE AN EXCITING PART TWO OF THIS UNPRECEDENTED SUPER SEASON.

A3 – DARREN CLARKE FEATURE

ANNC: The Mitsubishi Electric Championship. Always a great venue for the PGA TOUR Champions!

IN THE FIRST EVENT OF THE YEAR, DARREN CLARKE LOOKED TO START THE NEW YEAR THE SAME WAY HE ENDED THE LAST...

ANNC: Are you kidding me? How about it?

ANNC: A bogey-free 64 and winning in back-to-back starts.

DARREN CLARKE: That was pretty cool for me because I played, the last event that I played in 2020 was the TimberTech in Boca and I won that one and then go to Hualalai winning it in Hualalai again, which was a great way to start the season.

WITH TWO VICTORIES TO HIS NAME, DARREN CLARKE QUICKLY BECAME ONE THE BREAKOUT STARS OF THE 2020-2021 SEASON...

ANNC: His stroke looks very, very confident right now.

ANNC: Don't count him out as far as winning goes.

WHILE FINDING COMFORT ON THE SENIOR CIRCUIT, A MAJOR PART OF CLARKE'S SUCCESS HAS BEEN THE WORK HE'S PUT IN OUTSIDE THE ROPES...

DARREN CLARKE: Back in the gym again, working hard a bit more because I was getting too big, but also to try and get longevity, to try and not get injured, to help prevent that sort of stuff. But just generally to feel a lot fitter and feel a lot better.

ANNC: We saw him working on it all week on the range. He was really conscientious as far as sticking to what he was working on.

PAUL BROADHURST: He's working really hard. He'd be the first to admit that when he came out here the first year or so he struggled a bit. He wasn't in the greatest of forms. He's reinvented himself. And he's played great pretty much all season.

THAT HARD WORKED PAID OFF AGAIN EIGHT MONTHS AFTER HIS VICTORY IN HAWAII, AS CLARKE WENT HEAD-TO-HEAD WITH K.J. CHOI AT THE SANFORD INTERNATIONAL IN SIOUX FALLS, SOUTH DAKOTA.

ANNC: Oh my goodness! How good is that from Darren Clarke!

ANNC: Clarke for birdie, and the win...lips it in and Darren Clarke on the 2nd playoff hole takes the Sanford International!

COLIN MONTGOMERIE: He's working at it and he's got his belief back again. He believes he can win and the confidence and belief is everything.

DARREN CLARKE: I work hard because I wanna put myself in a position on Sunday afternoon where it makes a difference. To this day I enjoy this challenge of it.

BI – MAJOR CHAMPIONS INBUMP

JIM FURYK: Winning is always special. I was able to come out real quick and win my first two events...

ANNC: His second win in as many starts.

AFTER TWO WINS IN 2020, JIM FURYK ELEVATED HIS GAME IN A MAJOR WAY IN 2021...

JIM FURYK: To be able to come out on the Champions Tour and win a major championship and have that be the Senior U.S. Open, was special.

TWO WEEKS LATER, STEPHEN DODD BROKE THROUGH FOR HIS MAIDEN VICTORY ON THE CIRCUIT AT THE SENIOR OPEN.

BUT STEVE STRICKER MADE HIS NAME SYNONYMOUS WITH MAJOR CHAMPIONSHIPS, HOLDING THE 54-HOLE LEAD IN ALL THREE OF THE MAJORS HE PLAYED IN...

JERRY KELLY: The strength of Steve's game is really the mental side and the way he picks apart a golf course.

BUT AFTER FALLING SHORT IN HIS FIRST TWO ATTEMPTS, THE THIRD TIME...WAS THE CHARM.

ANNC: Steve Stricker is your 2021 Bridgestone SENIOR PLAYERS Champion!

STEVE STICKER: I always wanted to be a PLAYERS Championship winner so it's a special win.

ON THE TWO OCCASIONS THAT STRICKER WAS RUNNER UP...

IT WAS ONE OF THE TOUR'S BREAKOUT ROOKIES WHO GOT THE JOB DONE.

B2 – ALEX CEJKA FEATURE

ALEX CEJKA SPENT THE MAJORITY OF HIS GOLF CAREER SEARCHING FOR A CONSISTENT PLACE TO CALL HOME...

ANNC: He's played on every tour. Korn Ferry Tour events, small satellite tour events...

ROD PAMPLING: He's the journeyman who just hasn't stopped playing. So it's not unusual for that guy to come out on the Champions Tour and play well.

BUT AFTER TURNING 50 IN DECEMBER OF 2020, THE PGA TOUR CHAMPIONS PROVIDED HIM A HAVEN...THOUGH, THERE WERE OBSTACLES...

ALEX CEJKA: Before the first tournament I had some doubts. How I'm gonna play, how many tournaments I'm gonna get in. I didn't know how strong the field is, I don't know the courses, so I knew it's gonna be a very tricky and challenging year for me.

ONE OF THE FIRST HURDLES CEJKA FACED WAS GETTING INTO THE FIELD – WHICH WAS EVIDENT IN THE FIRST MAJOR OF THE YEAR...AS THE ODDS WERE STACKED AGAINST HIM GIVEN HIS POSITION ON THE ALTERNATE LIST THE WEEK PRIOR...

ALEX CEJKA: I was like maybe 11 out. So I kind of took a week off and on Monday, I get a text message that I'm suddenly in. So I was a little bit freaking out. I made my trip down there I think on Tuesday morning and the rest is history.

ANNC: Alex Cejka – in just his third start on the PGA TOUR Champions – has won the first major of the year!

ALEX CEJKA: It's a dream come true, especially a senior major – that's even more special.

BUT CEJKA IS NO STRANGER TO ADVERSITY ...

ALEX CEJKA: I was born in the Czech Republic. Back then communism. Occupied by Russians and there's nothing you can buy, nothing you can get, everybody is poor. My dad decided to leave and wanted to give me a better life.

BERNHARD LANGER: I'm sure that's why he's so resilient and determined. It's got to play a part in your whole DNA, what you go through in life.

ALEX CEJKA: It doesn't matter what comes, how many stones you put in our way.

CEJKA'S FAMILY FOUND A NEW HOME IN GERMANY, WHERE HE BEGAN PLAYING GOLF AND IDOLIZED BERNHARD LANGER...

ALEX CEJKA: We had the German Open in Frankfurt on my home golf course. I actually caddied for another pro back then. I was 14, and my player was paired with Bernhard Langer, the first two days. Then playing in Europe a couple of years later, we played a lot of practice rounds, so we kept really close.

BERNHARD LANGER: We've always had a great relationship. There's not many professional golfers that come from Germany. I always thought he would do well once he came out here and I told him just take care of yourself and you have fun out here and you'll do well and he already has.

ALEX CEJKA: He said 'play good, but don't play better than me!' (haha)

BUT CEJKA DIDN'T LISTEN – AND LIKE LANGER, CONTINUED TO FIND SUCCESS...

WINNING THE SEASON'S SECOND MAJOR – THE KITCHENAID SENIOR PGA CHAMPIONSHIP.

ALEX CEJKA: After the first one the pressure was totally gone. I just played incredible great golf and, I won.

ROD PAMPLING: What Alex did straightaway was unbelievable. Two majors is pretty impressive. I mean, it doesn't matter who it is.

PAUL BROADHURST: It's hard enough to win one, never mind the first two of the year.

ALEX CEJKA: When we talk about it, it's tough to believe. It sunk in but, it's just an incredible feeling especially as a rookie on this tour. Those couple of weeks I played were special.

CI – SEASON OF THE ROOKIE

ANNC: In only his second start in the PGA TOUR Champions...

ANNC: Ernie Els – in his third start on the PGA TOUR Champions...

ANNC: He becomes the 19th player in PGA TOUR Champions history to win in his debut!

ANNC: Shane Bertsch has become the fourth rookie to win on the PGA TOUR Champions this year!

KEVIN SUTHERLAND: This rookie class has been exceptional. I mean, it's like no other year that I've been out here.

ANNC: Rod Pampling...His first victory on the PGA TOUR Champions!

BERNHARD LANGER: It's become very competitive and it always has been, but more so the last year or two.

KEVIN SUTHERLAND: Phil Mickelson stands out, obviously, because he moves the needle so much.

ANNC: Becomes the 20th debut winner in the history of the PGA TOUR Champions!

PHIL MICKELSON: You look at a guy like Jim Furyk, who is one of the most precise strikers of the ball...

ANNC: He's won his first two starts on this tour.

PHIL MICKELSON: Great putter, great chipper, but just only lacks the speed to compete out on the regular tour. You put them out here and he's deadly.

BERNHARD LANGER: It makes it harder to win because these guys know how to win, they're used to winning, they expect to win, and they play to win.

ANNC: Mike Weir – 2003 Masters Champion – wins for the first time on the PGA TOUR Champions.

ALL IN ALL, 12 ROOKIES RACKED UP A TOTAL OF 19 WINS IN THE 2020-2021 SUPER SEASON...INCLUDING A BREAKTHROUGH VICTORY BY KOREA'S MOST CELEBRATED GOLFER.

C2 – K.J. CHOI FEATURE

ANNC: He was the first player from South Korea to win on the PGA TOUR; trying to become the first to win on the PGA TOUR Champions. For birdie and the win. About as close as you can get!

AFTER FALLING SHORT OF HIS FIRST PGA TOUR CHAMPIONS VICTORY, K.J. CHOI WAS LEFT WITH A TOUGH DECISION TO MAKE...

RIDE THE MOMENTUM THE FOLLOWING WEEK AT THE TOUR'S NEXT EVENT – OR RETURN HOME TO SOUTH KOREA WHERE HE WAS HOSTING HIS OWN INVITATIONAL ON THE KOREAN TOUR.

K.J. CHOI: Week before, in Sioux Falls and I play very well. I think about it months ago, 'skip or play?' So I'm thinking, okay, I play. Because my game is improving.

AND CHOI MADE THE RIGHT CHOICE.

ANNC: K.J. Choi has his first win on the PGA TOUR Champions! One of the most respected players in the game.

K.H. LEE: Hello Pro Choi, congratulations on the win. To the juniors you've given them so many good examples to follow. When we were on the tour together, you gave me good advice on how to play a long time and how to play well overall. This is part of reason why we are doing well.

SUNGJAE IM: Pro Choi, congratulations on the win. We will keep on cheering for you so that you can keep on winning.

K.H. LEE: When it comes to PGA TOUR Champions, you are the first Korean to win and have great achievements. Hope you win more and show us what we can set as an example.

K.J. CHOI: There was a period of time when we doubted our abilities to play on the PGA TOUR. I felt like I gave some motivation to the juniors, telling them "you can do it" and "do the best you can" because rewards will come if work hard and I think I showed that we can share the joy together.

C3 – FURYK & FRIENDS

CHOI'S VICTORY CONTRIBUTED TO THE TREND OF ROOKIE SUCCESS, AS DID THE TOUR'S NEWEST STOP...

ANNC: The Constellation FURYK & FRIENDS – a brand new event on the PGA TOUR Champions.

AND THE TOURNAMENT – MUCH LIKE ITS NAMESAKE – EXCEEDED EXPECTATIONS.

COLIN MONTGOMERIE: FURYK & FRIENDS was a fantastic success. I think one of the better tournaments of the year.

JIM FURYK: It's a special event, my wife and I have long had the Furyk & Friends event in Jacksonville. To get that support from the Champion's Tour, from our local community, from all the folks that have played in our event was really special.

ANNC: 69 of the top 72 in the current Schwab Cup standings are here.

COLIN MONTGOMERIE: I think it was the best field that we've had, everyone turned up to support Jim Furyk. This is a huge asset to our tour.

JIM FURYK: To put on a tournament of that magnitude and have it be successful and have it show as well as it did in the very first year, I'm really proud.

C4 – PHIL MICKELSON FEATURE

ANNC: Fabulous Phil – a three-time winner. Great way to kick off a brand new event on the PGA TOUR Champions.

PHIL MICKELSON: The FURYK & FRIENDS event was special to me because of my relationship with Jim and Tab. To be the inaugural champion means a lot to me.

PHIL'S 3RD VICTORY IN HIS 4TH PGA TOUR CHAMPIONS START CEMENTED NOT ONLY HIS DOMINANCE, BUT THE IMPACT THAT HE BRINGS TO THE CIRCUIT.

KEVIN SUTHERLAND: He's such a great asset to the game of golf and it's good to see him out here playing, and I hope he play a lot more.

AND HIS REBORN CONFIDENCE FROM WINNING ON THE PGA TOUR CHAMPIONS INSPIRED HIS HISTORIC MAJOR VICTORY.

JERRY KELLY: Winning breeds winning. Learning how to win again out here again, I'm sure helped him win the PGA Championship.

PHIL MICKELSON: Those moments are what drive me and why I continue to work hard and are what I will look back on and cherish throughout my career.

FRED COUPLES: I watched almost every shot Saturday and Sunday...he was a machine. Stared down Koepka. It was unreal, it was unreal.

AND AFTER HE TOOK DOWN ONE OF THE WORLD'S BEST GOLFERS, PHIL BROUGHT THAT WINNING MENTALITY BACK TO THE PGA TOUR CHAMPIONS.

JERRY KELLY: He comes out as the champion that he is and gets the job done. But it only helps us to play against him as well. You wanna play against the best and I think he's just about the best at our age.

PHIL MICKELSON: I love to compete, I love to have success. And these guys are competitive. They're great players. I really enjoy the experience of playing Champions Tour events.

AND WITH THE CHARLES SCHWAB CUP PLAYOFFS CULMINATING IN A PLACE NEAR TO MICKELSON'S HEART, PHIL SOUGHT OUT TO FURTHER HIS IMPACT.

D1 – CHARLES SCHWAB CUP – WHAT'S AT STAKE

ANNC: We are finally here...the Charles Schwab Cup Playoffs!

ERNIE ELS: The history of the Charles Schwab Cup speaks for itself. To get your name on that sure will feel like you've done something really well.

KEVIN SUTHERLAND: It's a big deal, the season ending champion is gonna be crowned, and this year is gonna be for two full years.

JIM FURYK: It'd feel special to come up here for the first year and be able to pull that off. But there's other guys thinking the same thing.

BERNHARD LANGER: It would mean a great deal because I'm 64 and this may be my last chance to win a Schwab Cup, as I'm getting older and there's a lot of young guys coming on tour. So right, now I'm in the driver's seat.

D2 – DOMINION ENERGY CHARITY CLASSIC

ANNC: 37th of 39 events in this extended, wraparound season. The Dominion Energy Charity Classic, the first stop in the Charles Schwab Cup Playoffs.

THE 2021 CHARLES SCHWAB CUP PLAYOFFS KICKED OFF IN RICHMOND VIRGINIA WITH BERNHARD LANGER SITTING ON TOP OF THE STANDINGS... WHO FOUND HIMSELF IN A SPOT HE IS ALL TOO FAMILIAR WITH.

ANNC: Bernhard Langer, very comfortable being a front runner. Knows how to get it done.

STARTING THE FINAL ROUND TWO SHOTS OFF THE LEAD, LANGER WENT INTO THE 54TH HOLE ONE SHOT BEHIND CLUBHOUSE LEADER, DOUG BARRON, AND KEPT HIS HOPES ALIVE WITH A BIRDIE AND A SHARE OF THE LEAD AT 14-UNDER.

ANNC: Just the second time that the Dominion Energy Charity Classic has ever gone to a playoff.

AND WITH A BIRDIE ON THE FIRST PLAYOFF HOLE, LANGER SEALED HIS SECOND VICTORY OF THE SUPER SEASON.

ANNC: Win number 42 for Bernhard Langer. The oldest winner in PGA TOUR Champions history. 64 years, 1 month, 27 days. And 15-consecutive years with a win.

BERNHARD LANGER: It felt great relief in a sense. I knew I could do it because I was in contention so many times. I just need to do the best I can do on any given day, any different golf course that we play and hopefully that would be good enough.

WITH THE WIN, LANGER EXTENDED HIS LEAD IN THE CHARLES SCHWAB CUP STANDINGS OVER JIM FURYK...AND WITH TWO TOURNAMENTS REMAINING,

THE IDEA OF A 6TH CAREER CHARLES SCHWAB CUP STARTED TO BECOME CLOSER TO A REALITY.

D3 – BERNHARD LANGER FEATURE

ANNC: He is the ageless wonder.

ANNC: He's been a threat every single week. He's either top 10 or challenging for the win.

KEVIN SUTHERLAND: It's just truly amazing. I don't think people understand how hard it is, what he's doing at his age.

ANNC: To do what he's doing at 64 years of age, Bernhard is a fighter.

KEVIN SUTHERLAND: I can just tell you how much my body has aged since I've turned 50, and I'm 57...I can't imagine what am gonna feel like when I'm 64.

COLIN MONTGOMERIE: To see him doing what he's doing at 64 is quite phenomenal, and he's hot favorite to win. It'll be a record that'll stand the test of time, I tell you, for someone to win the Charles Schwab Cup at 64 years old.

ANNC: So prepared every time he comes out to play and I think that's what gives him that advantage.

BERNHARD LANGER: I need to be healthy to be doing what am doing. That's the key. I need to have fun and be somewhat successful. If those three things are in place, I'll probably continue.

FRED COUPLES: It's incredible. He'll win again. He'll win again at 65, and then we'll worry about 66 when that comes. But, he'll win again.

D4 – TIMBERTECH CHAMPIONSHIP / STEVEN ALKER FEATURE

ANNC: The TimberTech Championship, the second playoff event in the Charles Schwab Cup Playoffs.

ENTERING THE PENULTIMATE EVENT SECOND IN THE CHARLES SCHWAB CUP STANDINGS, JIM FURYK NEEDED A STRONG SHOWING TO CLOSE THE GAP ON BERNHARD LANGER...AND WITH A 66 AND 64 IN THE FIRST TWO ROUNDS, THE ROOKIE HELD A SHARE OF THE LEAD.

ANNC: Jim Furyk is applying the pressure to points leader, Bernhard Langer.

ANNC: What a wonderful shot by Furyk!

MEANWHILE, FELLOW ROOKIE, STEVEN ALKER, STARTED THE FINAL ROUND ONE SHOT BEHIND THE LEADERS, AND WITH A BIRDIE TO TIE THE

LEAD ON THE NINTH, THE KIWI PUT HIMSELF IN A POSITION THAT SEEMED IMPOSSIBLE FOUR MONTHS AGO...

ANNC: Steven Alker, what a story!

ANNC: He turned 50 in July. He's not a member of the PGA TOUR Champions. Open qualified for the Boeing Classic, tied for seventh, which got him into the Ally Challenge where he was solo third, tied for ninth at the Ascencion Charity Classic, tied for seventh at the Sanford International and that's how he's getting into these tournaments.

STEVEN ALKER: I just wanted to get out and get a feel for some events if I could qualify. Focus on Tour School, get my game ready for that. I was just kinda rolling with it. I mean, it was kinda black and white. If I wanted to keep playing I either had to be the best, Top 10, or win, obviously.

JIM FURYK: I was able to play with them in the final round of our event, the Constellation FURYK & FRIENDS and I told him he was knocking on the door.

WITH SEVEN TOP 10'S IN EIGHT EVENTS, ALKER PLAYED HIS WAY INTO THE TIMBERTECH CHAMPIONSHIP – WHERE HE WENT HEAD-TO-HEAD WITH FURYK THROUGHOUT THE BACK NINE.

ANNC: That was clutch. Doesn't look very afraid, does he?

WITH A ONE-SHOT LEAD GOING INTO THE FINAL HOLE, ALKER WOULD HOLD ON TO EARN HIS FIRST VICTORY ON THE PGA TOUR CHAMPIONS.

ANNC: Steven Alker, a first-time winner on the PGA TOUR Champions!

STEVEN ALKER: You never know when you're gonna win, so that was just the week for me. And the game was in good shape, and putted well, everything kinda just fell into place.

JIM FURYK: It always stinks to finish second. It's bitter, but I was still really happy for him. He's worked really hard and he played so well.

STEVEN ALKER: It's always great to win, the feeling I got playing with Jim down the stretch. Just give myself as many chances as possible. And another win on the Champions, that would be great. If it can be more than one, even better.

D5 – CHARLES SCHWAB SUP CHAMPIONSHIP / ROLLOUT

ANNC: It is on to the Charles Schwab Cup Championship. The final playoff event in the race for the Charles Schwab Cup.

WITH THE FATE OF THE CHARLES SCHWAB CUP IN HIS HANDS, BERNHARD LANGER STRUGGLED IN THE FIRST TWO ROUNDS, BUT BATTLED BACK, AND CARDED A 63-69 OVER THE WEEKEND TO FINISH THE TOURNAMENT 17TH.

HE EARNED ENOUGH POINTS TO FORCE JIM FURYK TO PLACE NO WORSE THAN A TIE FOR SECOND TO EARN THE CHARLES SCHWAB CUP TROPHY...

AFTER THE FIRST THREE ROUNDS, FURYK HELD A *ONE*-SHOT LEAD... WITH HIS EYES ON *TWO* TROPHIES...BUT QUICKLY FOUND HIMSELF OUT OF CONTENTION TO WIN THE TOURNAMENT.

ANNC: That is Furyk's 2nd bogey on the back nine.

TWO GROUPS AHEAD OF FURYK, ARIZONA NATIVE PHIL MICKELSON SURGED...

ANNC: Phil moves to 17-under and share of the lead!

AND WITH A BIRDIE ON THE 18TH, CLAIMED HIS 4TH VICTORY IN SIX EVENTS.
