WOODS: I almost broke Fluff's hand. I almost broke Omar's hand and Rusty ended up hugging me because I ended up missing his hand. He put his arm around me because he didn't want me to crush his hand so I was going nuts, place was going nuts and we were all having a good time.

URESTI: We were going back for the high five and my brother I just vaguely remember hear him go, Bro be careful when we were swinging So I held up and missed. And then we went back and made it on the second one. I just didn't want to hurt my hand as hard as he was swinging as pumped as he was.

HOMA: JT can pull pull off some of that stuff but most of us don't have that in our in our bag as the kid's say. I would just get ridiculed if I did it. Tiger could just do whatever. I don't know he didn't throw out his shoulder when he fist bump but that's neither here nor there.

## JASON KOKRAK FEATURE

KOKRAK: the last fourteen, fifteen months have been pretty spectacular for me so I can't complain. Breaking off that first win, I told everybody that I was a slow learner and 10 years is pretty slow.

ANNC: Better than a decade on TOUR, more than 200 PGA TOUR starts and at last and does that ever feel good.

KOKRAK: But once I figured out it's, I smelled the blood in the water and I figured out pretty fast.

ANNC: His third win within the space of a year. He's starting to get that confidence, he is a player to lookout for at the biggest events.

KOKRAK: Confidence is huge, it goes exponentially farther than anything else. Being happy with whom I am and what I've done on the tour. but also having a little bit of confidence in knowing that you don't have to be perfect with the game of golf

ANNC: This guy has improved his putting so well.

KOKRAK: The putting, I think was a major key hiring Drew Steckel four years ago, hiring David Robinson my caddy D ROB for five years ago now. It is a huge key, I mean, I hired those guys to keep keep an eye on things and D Rob is one of the best screen readers on tour.

ANNC: Well done Jason, good up and down.

KOKRAK: You have to go into the tournament prepared, knowing the golf course and not overextend yourself, trying to learn the golf course itself. I think you just have to play your strengths. You can't force the win, you can't force yourself to do anything you have to let it come to you. And just be in the moment and let happen.that's kind of what I've told myself coming down the stretch and it seems to be working out.

## BUMP

ALLEN: Do that every time. My agent called me and was like, "do you want to play in this?" and I was like "absolutely". Can't say no to it. I just want to play well and not hit anybody in the head with a golf ball. I'm out here just trying to have some fun.

ANNC: there you go, he's come back from as many as 7 down today

WOODS: it's important to hit the ball in the right spots. And that year I did a lot of that.

ANNC: the streak continues...a day not to be believed

WOODS: I hit the ball in good spots and made a lot of putts too.

Short courses. That's how I started. I grew up playing a par three golf course, that's the easiest way to learn.

I just like to have options. I want to be able to putt off every tee, want to be able to say, hit fancy shots, curving around structures or especially bump and run it. That's what I love about playing overseas and links golf. I love using the ground and all of my short courses have that ability.

I personally like having the ability to build a putt off of every hole. The only hole here will be the second hole in which can have the option not to putt because obviously trying to replicate the number seven down there, but other than that you can putt on every hole.

I just think that everyone is going to who's going to play this golf course is going to enjoy the playability of it. It's going to be fun. It's going to have options. And I like that personally.

I've played on this golf course, probably about six or seven times. It's fun to go out with buddies and play out here. It's a huge honor to be able to add my name to this facility and this this is complex.

#### AUSTIN SMOTHERMAN AT THE HAY

### DJ GREGORY FEATURE

ANNC: That young man, his name is DJ Gregory. He's got cerebral palsy. He is following every round of every PGA TOUR event this year, walking.

GREGORY: I'm 44 years old I was born 10-weeks pre mature, I was in an incubator for the first month of my life. I've had eleven surgeries all together. Luckily my cerebral palsy only affects my balance. I mean, I'm sure some people wish it would affect my speech so I wouldn't talk as much

NAT: I'm not going to knock you over! Alright, hey the round's over, it doesn't matter!

ANNC: Remember our friend that walked every hole back ion 2008, DJ Gregory? He's created a foundation this year called, Walking For Kids. Each week he saddles up with one player and the player donates a portion of his winnings to DJ's charity.

RAHM: You know he was not dealt the best hand in his life and he made something wonderful out of it and the fact that he goes out there and walks as much as he does with the difficulty he has to walk, its very very impressive. He's captured a lot of hearts of us players definitely mine. We need more people like him in this world and he is great example.

NANTZ: I met him years ago when he was just a little boy. From that, just a friendship evolved. I had no idea this would be such a vital part of his life going tournament to tournament and really embodying in so many ways the spirit of the PGA Tour.

JOHNSON: He's one of the strongest individuals I've ever been associated with and certainly an individual that has a heat of gold and loves to serve and loves to work. I mean it is not easy what he does.

NANTZ: More than anything, I am inspired by him. It's one of the coolest things in 37 years of broadcasting. One of the most beautiful stories I've ever seen.

GREGORY: 2008 when we first had the idea of just walking every hole of every event and following a different player and doing the blog for the PGA Tour website, because of the positive response that we had from players and fans and media in 2008, that's how I decided, what else can I do to motivate and inspire others? And that's how, you know, the idea came about for the Walking For Kids Foundation and so that started in 2010 and it's been pretty awesome ever since. Each week I have a different player who I'll walk the golf course with and they will make a donation to my foundation, Walking For Kids.

It doesn't have to be organizations that help kids with cerebral palsy, it's organizations that help kids with all kinds of special needs, we just surpassed a million dollars in December, which was

really awesome. And honestly, it's just continuing to do what I do and hopefully raising more money to help kids achieve their goals and dreams one step at a time.

NAT: Can't birdie every hole until you birdie the first hole right! There ya go!

DAY: What he does, it's just amazing to be out here and walk the amount of miles that he does with what he's got. Just showing a lot of true grit and courage just to be able to do that and what the dollars go to.

RAHM: He is so inspiring and somebody we love and somebody who is part of our family. I remember in there was one year where we basically met after the round every single day just to have a good time just because he is that great to hangout with

DAY: I can't say it on camera but, we have a good time when we're together.

GREGORY: We were at Pebble Beach for the US Open a few years ago, and I was following Jason Day. And Rickie Fowler was in our group.... And he'll probably hate me for telling the story. But we were walking down the first hole and I tripped on the car path. And so he walked past me, and he was, can you hurry up and get up? You're holding us back. And so we all had a good laugh. It was funny. He's one of my best friends, that's what we do.

NANTZ: He was never going to be able to play golf like the guys that he follows on a week to week basis. He found, though even better, another way to connect with the game and be a part of it.

JOHNSON: His mission is very evident and his endurance, stamina, whatever you want to call it is paramount. Every week he wins.

DJ: I never thought that I would still be doing it 14 years later, but I love what I do and I don't have any plans to stop anytime soon.
