FOR THREE DECADES, THE UNITED STATES HAS TURNED THIS GLOBAL COMPETITION INTO AN AMERICAN CLASSIC ...

ANNC: A final dagger ... of a dominating day by the Americans! U.S. unbeatable today!

BUT THE INTERNATIONAL SIDE HAS EMBRACED ITS NEW IDENTITY, AND IS READY TO REWRITE THE SCRIPT ...

TAYLOR PENDRITH: Everybody's all in now. We're super pumped to play as one for the black and gold.

ANNC: The sweep is in the books! Incredible! We've got a 5-5 tie heading to the weekend.

HOPING THAT THE BOND THEY'VE BUILT IS STRONG ENOUGH TO TAKE DOWN THE AMERICAN JUGGERNAUT ...

ANNC: That was crazy clutch good! America in control again!

ANNC: Matsuyama on Scheffler! Number one in the world on the ropes here!

ADAM SCOTT: The International team has come a long way in this tournament. And, of course, we would top it off by winning.

BUT THE UNITED STATES HAVE PLANS TO AUTHOR YET ANOTHER VINTAGE PERFORMANCE ...

COLLIN MORIKAWA: We have one goal; that's to bring the cup back home.

ANNC: And the United States is now just a point away.

THIS IS THE 20-24 PRESIDENTS CUP OFFICIAL FILM – BROUGHT TO YOU BY GLOBAL PARTNERS ROLEX, ONE PASSWORD, AND COGNIZANT.

<u>A2 – THE ROYAL MONTREAL GOLF CLUB</u>

FOR THE FIRST TIME SINCE 2007, THE PRESIDENTS CUP RETURNS TO THE OLDEST GOLF COURSE IN NORTH AMERICA – THE ROYAL MONTREAL GOLF CLUB ...

COLLIN MORIKAWA: I'd say Royal Montreal, honestly, is pretty straightforward. It's got it's mix of length and short holes, but the greens are fairly small. There's a lot of undulation.

ADAM SCOTT: The greens are the challenge this week – etting it in the right spot, missing it in the right spot – that's where the matches are going to be won and lost.

WYNDHAM CLARK: It's kind of a tale of two nines. The front nine doesn't really have any water or trouble ... and then you go to the back side and it's a little more tactical.

COREY CONNERS: There's a lot of water in play, a lot of kind of risk reward shots.

SCOTTIE SCHEFFLER: 14, 15, 16, 17, 18 all have water in play. And so, it should be a pretty, pretty exciting finish.

TAYLOR PENDRITH: It's just your typical Canadian course. Really spectator friendly golf course. You'll be able to hear the roars through the trees cut out.

TOM KIM: The fans are going to be really, really happy with this one.

CANADIAN FANS REMEMBER FONDLY THE LAST TIME THE PRESIDENTS CUP WAS PLAYED AT ROYAL MONTREAL ...

ANNC: And a huge day for Mike Weir and Canada!

MIKE WEIR: I played really well that day. So did Tiger. It was a great memory, to, to play well against him here in front of your own fans. No doubt.

<u>A3 – OPENING CEREMONY</u>

NATS: 2003 Masters champion. He became the first Canadian in history to compete in the Presidents Cup.

NATS: (in French)

NATS: Please welcome, Mike Weir!

NATS: Please welcome, Jim Furyk!

JIM FURYK: It's truly an honor for us to represent our country, the United States of America, into what should be an amazing and a very exciting week. Thank you.

MIKE WEIR: (in French)

MIKE WEIR: As I stand here on the first tee of this historic and magnificent golf course, I'm as proud as a Canadian as you can imagine. Let's have a great event, everybody. Merci beaucoup!

<u> A4 – THURSDAY FOUR-BALL PART 1</u>

ANNC: The first tee revving up for five four-ball matches set to begin ... Jason Day teaming up with Ben An and they've got the formidable American duo of Xander Schauffele and Tony Finau.

IN FRONT OF THEIR HOME CROWD, THE INTERNATIONALS WIN THE FIRST HOLE WITH CONFIDENCE ...

ANNC: Oh, Jason Day ... walks it in from long range!

BUT THE AMERICANS TAKE EARLY, 1UP LEADS IN THE NEXT THREE MATCHES ...

ANNC: Right in the middle of the hole goes Kegan Bradley. To make one on the first hole that can really get your mind set in the right place for the rest of the round.

ALTHOUGH THE UNITED STATES BUILDS MOMENTUM, THE BLACK AND GOLD FIGHT BACK TO TAKE LEADS IN TWO OF THE MATCHES ...

ANNC: Good look here for Conners. Is it enough? Yes. That's what they need.

ANNC: Back to the 8th ... Adam Scott, he and Min Woo Lee tied with Morikawa and Theegala ... the oldest guy on either side just about jarred it. And Adam Scott strikes for the Internationals.

BUT THE U.S. TEAM RESPONDS, AND TAKE CONTROL IN FOUR OF THE FIVE MATCHES ...

ANNC: Xander Schauffele with a big putt at the 10th there.

INCLUDING RUSSELL HENLEY AND SCOTTIE SCHEFFLER, WHO TAKE A 2UP LEAD OVER SUNGJAE IM AND TOM KIM ... AND ALTHOUGH SCHEFFLER AND KIM ARE CLOSE FRIENDS OFF THE COURSE, THEIR MATCH GETS PERSONAL AT THE PAR 3, 7^{TH} ...

ANNC: Tom Kim trying to fight back ... got it to go. They need a spark. They're 2DN.

ANNC: Scheffler to tie ...

NATS: What was that!?

ANNC: Look at that! Woah! Scheffler showing some emotion as well!

SCHEFFLER'S EMPHATIC REPSONSE IS UNUSUAL FOR THE USUALLY RESERVED LEADER OF THE U.S. TEAM.

A5 – SCOTTIE SCHEFFLER – LEADER BY EXAMPLE

JIM FURYK: Scottie is quiet. Scottie's a guy that's going to kind of lead by example ... great example as well.

SCOTTIE SCHEFFLER: I'm not going to go in there trying to do anything different other than be myself and be a good teammate and a good friend of the guys.

SAM BURNS: A lot of us just look up to him for who he is as a person and also, obviously, what he does on the golf course. And so, he doesn't really need to kind of step out vocally.

WYNDHAM CLARK: Scottie is definitely one of those leaders that's more of watch what I do and he does in the actions. He's not as verbal about his leadership, but he's definitely a leader.

IT'S EASY FOR THE WORLD'S NUMBER ONE RANKED PLAYER TO LET HIS PLAY DO THE TALKING, BUT HE ENTERS THE 20-24 PRESIDENTS CUP WITH AN 0-5-AND-3 RECORD IN THE LAST TWO TEAM COMPITIONS ...

SCOTTIE SCHEFFLER: It's going to be hard for our team to win if I'm not out there delivering some points. In match play there's certain times in matches where there's an important putt or an important shot to kind of swing momentum. And I feel like at the last couple of team events, I hadn't been able to do that. And so, I'm definitely hoping to change that this year.

TONY FINAU: You can't be as good as he is without being extremely competitive. And that's the thing about Scottie, is that he's just extremely competitive. He's just a great guy to be around and a great teammate to have.

<u>A6 – THURSDAY FOUR-BALL PART 2</u>

SCHEFFLER'S LEADERSHIP IS ON DISPLAY FOR RUSSELL HENLEY'S PRESIDENTS CUP DEBUT ... BUT THE DUO HAVE THEIR WORK CUT OUT AGAINST SUNGJAE IM AND TOM KIM ...

ANNC: To 8, for birdie is Tom Kim. Can he do it again? That's a little youthful exuberance. Scheffler there to hear it again. He turned his back to him. He didn't even look at him.

AND THE INTERNATIONAL MOMENTUM CONTINUES FOR JASON DAY AND BEN AN, WHO PULL EVEN ON 16 ...

ANNC: Okay, you talk about flipping a match, this is a big par putt for Schauffele to keep this 1UP lead ... Finau and Schauffele both miss and theres new life for the Internationals in this one!

BUT XANDER SCHAUFFELE QUICKLY REGAINS CONTROL ...

ANNC: Boy, what a tough spot for the Internationals just to stand here and watch as the best putter in the game has an uphiller from nine feet.

ANNC: There it is the full point for the U.S. And the Americans win the opening match.

XANDER SCHAUFFELE: We knew what we were supposed to do and Tony, Tony got the party started. He had my back all day and, you know, I figured it was my turn to have his back.

ALTHOUGH SCOTTIE SCHEFFLER AND TOM KIM PROVIDED THE FIREWORKS EARLY, IT IS RUSSELL HENLEY WHO DELIVERS IN THE CLUTCH FOR THE AMERICANS ...

ANNC: 14 in the fairway, Russell Henley ... woah! A beauty! Conceded for birdie.

SCOTTIE SCHEFFLER: Russell stepped there in a big way on 14 and 15 with back-to-back birdies to give us a 3UP lead.

ANNC: This one is a long time coming for World Number One, Scottie Scheffler, who teams up with Russell Henley, the Presidents Cup Rookie, and two matches in the books two go to the red, white, and blue.

AND COLLIN MORIKAWA KEEPS THE PRESSURE ON THE INTERNATIONALS AT THE $14^{\rm TH}\ldots$

ANNC: Morikawa gets it to go! And the Americans win that hole, they go 1UP.

HE AND THEEGALA CARRY THAT 1UP LEAD THE REMAINDER OF THE DAY, AS MIN WOO LEE AND ADAM SCOTT PUSH A SECOND MATCH TO THE 18TH HOLE ...

COLLIN MORIKAWA: We grinded out there and just never let up.

ANNC: Another full point! 3-0 U.S. with two matches remaining.

HOLDING A 1UP LEAD SINCE THE 8TH HOLE, PATRICK CANTLAY AND SAM BURNS ADD SOME BREATHING ROOM ON 13 ...

ANNC: To win the hole, Burns for birdie ... oh, what a putt there Sam! Sam Burns gives him and Patrick Cantlay a commanding 2UP lead!

AND MAINTAIN THAT LEAD OVER CONNERS AND MATSUYAMA ...

ANNC: This one is over as well. 2&1 victory for Cantlay and Burns.

WITH ONE CHANCE REMAINING FOR THE INTERNATIONAL TEAM TO AVOID THE SWEEP, CHRISTIAAN BEZUIDENHOUT STRUGGLES TO CONVERT ON MULTIPLE OPPORTUNITIES ...

ANNC: The miss from seven feet at 14, the miss at 16 from seven feet, another chance from seven feet here to tie the match ... three misses from that same distance for Bezuidenhout. They were all huge. Not one.

LEAVING WYNDHAM CLARK AND KEEGAN BRADLEY THE OPPORTUNITY TO CLOSE THE DOOR ON THE THIRD MATCH TO REACH THE 18TH HOLE ...

ANNC: Keegan Bradley with the final dagger of a dominating day by the Americans! A clean five-zip sweep!

KEEGAN BRADLEY: To be around the guys and just to see how into it they are and how much they love each other and are just friends it's just uh, it's inspiring for me.

JIM FURYK: Tough matches. I think it was, uh, definitely a lot closer than 5-0. We're excited with our start. I think we also, you know, go in there, celebrate, high fives, hugs, but we've gotta, we've gotta hunker down and get ready for tomorrow. A new format, another five matches. Hey, we want to keep the pressure on.

ANNC: U.S. unbeatable today. And they're going to lead for the 38^{th} time after the last 42 sessions ... and they've never lost the Presidents Cup when they've taken the lead after the first session. They are 10 for 10.

<u> B1 – FRIDAY FOURSOMES PART 1</u>

ANNC: Day two of the Presidents Cup where the International side is hoping that this home Canadian crowd can spur them on to a comeback on this Friday – they need it.

FUELED BY THE ELECTRIC ATMOSPHERE, SUNGJAE IM AND HIDEKI MATSUYAMA GET OFF TO A HOT START AGAINST PATRICK CANTLAY AND XANDER SCHAUFFELE ...

ANNC: Hideki Matsuyama at the second for birdie ... Matsuyama walks it in! It's another winning hole. And there's that first 2UP International lead of this Presidents Cup.

JASON DAY AND CHRISTIAAN BEZUIDENHOUT FOLLOW SUIT AND TAKE AN EARLY LEAD OVER MAX HOMA AND BRIAN HARMAN ...

ANNC: Here's Bezuidenhout, the lone South African on the International side, and another chance to win a hole ... wow! That'll give him a boost of confidence.

AND THE CANDIAN DUO OF MACKENZIE HUGHES AND COREY CONNERS FURTHER INVIGORATE THEIR HOME CROWD EARLY IN THEIR MATCH AGAINST WYNDHAM CLARK AND TONY FINAU ...

ANNC: The Canadians strike first at the first! And you've got three shaded gold spots there up for the Internationals.

HUGHES' PRESIDENTS CUP DEBUT COULDN'T BE OFF TO A BETTER START – AND IT'S A MOMENT THAT HAS BEEN YEARS IN THE MAKING.

<u> B2 – MACKENZIE HUGHES – FITTING FIRST</u>

MACKENZIE HUGHES: This is the pinnacle of my career so far. Playing for Mike, in Canada. This is really what dreams are made of. I wish I had, made it a little easier. But I also knew my game was, was in good shape.

MIKE WEIR: Mac's a, you know, he's a passionate guy. You know he, he wanted this very badly. And he was, you know, right on the bubble here.

IF YOU BELIEVE IN FATE, LOOK NO FURTHER THAN DUNDAS, ONTARIO NATIVE, MACKENZIE HUGHES, MAKING HIS PRESIDENTS CUP DEBUT IN CANADA – TWO YEARS AFTER NOT BEING SELECTED TO PLAY FOR THE INTERNATIONAL TEAM IN HIS ADOPTED HOMETOWN OF CHARLOTTE, NORTH CAROLINA ...

TREVOR IMMELMAN: In '22, Mackenzie in particular was an extremely difficult call for me to make.

2022 MACKENZIE HUGHES: I was disappointed in myself. I hadn't played the kind of golf I wanted to leading up to the picks, And then, yeah, kind of lit a fire in me a little bit.

TREVOR IMMELMAN: The toughness with which he, he took that adversity, so to speak, he immediately made it known to all of us how important it was for him to make this cup in his home country.

ANNC: There it is! For the second time in his career, Mackenzie Hughes has won in a playoff!

TWO YEARS LATER, HUGHES FOUND HIMSELF IN A SIMILAR SPOT, IN NEED OF A CAPTAIN'S SELCTION FROM MIKE WEIR ...

MACKENZIE HUGHES: I see Mike's calling me, and I'm like, 'oh, boy.' So, you know, my heart starts to flutter. He kind of said, 'well, you know, we've had a tough couple of days making decisions and we've had a few tough phone calls to make', so I was like, 'oh man, it's coming.' And then he goes, 'but you're on the team. You made the team.' And I was like, I mean, just pure elation, excitement, relief. I thought about this for so long, so to get that news was something I'll never forget.

MACKENZIE HUGHES: The hope is that this is the first of many, and no better place to start than here in Canada with Mike at the helm. It's a really cool moment and something I won't take for granted.

IN ADDITION TO CAPTAIN WEIR, HUGHES IS JOINED BY TWO FELLOW PLAYING CANADIANS ... AND THE TRIO SHARE A UNIQUE BOND ...

MACKENZIE HUGHES: Corey and I go back to when we were 12 or 13 years old playing junior golf together and Taylor as well through junior golf days and then playing at Kent State.

ANNC: Such a good story, these Canadian players, they all played on the Kent State college golf team. Could they have ever imagined playing with their college teammates, in a huge Presidents Cup.

COREY CONNERS: Not a chance we ever, you know, would think of us all being a part of a Presidents Cup; just beyond our, our wildest imaginations. It's pretty cool that it's a reality.

TYLOR PENDRITH: We have obviously been good buddies for a long time. Me and Corey, four years at Kent State together and me and him had two with Mac. It's a great golf program. Herb Page, legendary Canadian coach; feels like home.

MACKENZIE HUGHES: To think back to when we were 18 years old in the dorms at Kent State to where we are now as professionals here in Montreal playing for the Presidents Cup. It's the icing on top of the already a great week.

<u> B3 – FRIDAY FOURSOMES PART 2</u>

ANNC: Mackenzie Hughes trying to light things up at the second for birdie to win the hole and grab a 2UP lead ... Mackenzie Hughes adds to the atmosphere!

WHILE THE CANADIAN TANDEM ADDS FUEL TO THE FIRE, FELLOW COUNTRYMAN TAYLOR PENDRITH AND HIS AUSSIE PARTNER ADAM SCOTT HEAT UP IN THE MIDDLE OF THE FRONT NINE ...

ANNC: Back up to five, Adam Scott with a birdie to win the hole ... perfectly dripped in by the veteran!

WITH THE MOMENTUM FIRMLY IN FAVOR OF THE INTERNATIONAL SIDE, A COUPLE OF AMERICAN PAIRINGS PUT UP A FIGHT ...

ANNC: We go to three ... Homa with a chance to win the hole with a birdie ... so that match goes back to tied! Well-played hole by the Americans.

ANNC: At the second, from 130 yards, Scottie Scheffler ... how good is this guy? Kick in! So the Americans have a rare winning hole and a rare lead today.

BUT THE KOREAN PAIRING OF BEN AN AND SI WOO KIM TAKE TWO OF THE NEXT FOUR HOLES TO TAKE THE LEAD OVER SCOTTIE SCHEFFLER AND RUSSELL HENLEY ...

ANNC: Way back with the third and what does he do!? He just about holes it! ... That's the kind of day it's been for this team!

WHILE DAY AND BEZUIDENHOUT WIN CONSECUTIVE HOLES TO TAKE A 2UP LEAD ...

ANNC: Significant leads now across the board! Yesterday, it was all red. Today, it's a golden Friday so far for the International side – exactly what they needed!

WITH LEADS IN ALL FIVE MATCHES, CONNERS AND HUGHES TAKE A COMMANDING LEAD THRU NINE HOLES ...

ANNC: This Canadian duo is on fire, like everybody else is around the course ... and they are putting on a show today. 5UP.

AND THE OPENING ACT OF MATSUYAMA AND IM GO 7UP WITH SEVEN HOLES TO PLAY ...

ANNC: What a beatdown, Matsuyama and Im are putting on the Americans!

AND FINISH THE MATCH WITH THEIR SEVENTH-CONSECUTIVE BIRDIE ...

ANNC: 3'4" for the win ... one of the biggest blowouts in Presidents Cup history – in fact, it ties the largest margin of victory – 7&6 in the opening match. The statement maker for Mike Weir and company.

WITH THEIR FIRST POINT OF THE 20-24 PRESIDENTS CUP, AND LEADS IN THE REMAINING FOUR MATCHES, THE INTERNATIONAL TEAM LOOKS STRONGER THAN EVER, A PURSUIT THAT'S BEEN YEARS IN THE MAKING, TO UNITE AS ONE UNDER "THE SHIELD".

<u>B4 – UNITED BY THE SHIELD</u>

ADAM SCOTT: I look back at Royal Melbourne in 2019 and the creation of the International Shield and where that's gone in the last two Presidents Cups really giving this team an identity, bringing guys together.

ERNIE ELS: Following the 2017 Presidents Cup, I felt the time was right to really make a change in what is our identity. We come from all over the world, nationalities, we play for different flags and I felt we needed our own identity to play for.

TOM KIM: It's such an individual sport and for us to be able to represent one logo for a lot of different countries is a special feeling.

ANNC: There's momentum building for the International side over the last two, three Presidents Cups. They've talked about rallying behind that shield and I think a lot of that is due to the influence of Els, influence of Trevor Immelman, and of course Mike Weir this week.

TREVOR IMMELMAN: We've started to spend more and more time together and you understand the different personalities and exactly where everybody fits into the team.

MIKE WEIR: The chemistry with the team is incredible. We've started having these kind of team dinners and get togethers for a number of years now and I think it just paid dividends.

TAYLOR PENDRITH: They've done a really good job giving us something to play for and play under. Everybody's bought into the shield. So, we're super pumped to play as one and unite as one and play for the black and gold and we're ready.

<u>B5 – FRIDAY FOURSOMES PART 3</u>

FEW PLAYERS BETTER REPRESENT THE SHIELD THAN 11-TIME INTERNATIONAL TEAM MEMBER ADAM SCOTT, WHO'S PUTTER STAYS HOT ON THE $11^{\rm TH}$ HOLE ...

ANNC: To go 4UP in this match ... and does! Boy, the beatdown continues!

ADAM SCOTT: We came out and we knew we were playing well. We felt that earlier in the week and we just had to get on with it today. There's a lot of fight in this team; we're not gonna go away.

ANNC: Adam Scott has his 22nd point won in the Presidents Cup. That takes him past Ernie for the most won by an International player. 5&4, another decisive win!

AND CONNERS AND HUGHES DELIVER THE KNOCKOUT BLOW AT THE PAR 3, 13TH WITH A PERFECT ONE-TWO PUNCH ...

ANNC: Little club twirl there, Smilie ... oh! ... they win this hole, they close it out, and this place will erupt.

ANNC: This is a putt that Mackenzie Hughes has been dreaming of a long time, to win a match at the Presidents Cup ... why wouldn't the two Canadians playing together ... jump on the bandwagon here with a huge, lopsided win, 6&5.

MACKENZIE HUGHES: This is one of the highlights of my life right here. This is one of the funnest days I've ever had on a golf course.

WITH THREE MATCHES FINISHED EARLY, BEZUIDENHOUT AND DAY ARE PUSHED TO THE 18TH HOLE BY HOMA AND HARMAN ... AND THE AUSSIE VETERAN COMES THROUGH IN THE CLUTCH TO PRESERVE THEIR 1UP LEAD ...

ANNC: He has to make terrific contact here to keep it around the flag ... he's got one of the best short games of this generation and Jason Day just delivered again! Another full point on the board for the Internationals!

NOW ONE MATCH AWAY FROM A 5-NIL SWEEP, SI WOO KIM PUTS THE INTERNATIONALS AHEAD ...

ANNC: At the 13th, 211-yard par three ... starting right at it, staying right at it, good, big club twirl and he's stalkin' right after it. He looked like he loved it AND IT'S A BEAUTY! Siwoo Kim! Out-dueling Scottie Scheffler – the best in the business – with an iron.

KIM AND AN MAINTAIN THEIR 1UP LEAD AS THE MATCH HEADS TO THE FINISHING HOLE, BUT THE AMERICANS HAVE A CHANCE TO WIN THE HOLE AND STOP THE SWEEP ...

ANNC: See how bold Henley gets here ... and that should be good enough for the four.

ANNC: Everything has gone the Internationals' way. Can they get it one more time? Can they make that one, last crucial putt and make it a 5-0 Friday ... the sweep is in the books! Incredible!

ANNC: Siwoo Kim delivers the final blow ... and we've got the first back-to-back sweeps in sessions ... in cup history ... 5-5 we go, into the weekend.

BEN AN: We came back today, pretty strong. Yesterday was rough, but you know, we always believe in ourselves, so um, we are glad that we got back in the game.

ANNC: This International team hasn't had a whole lot to cheer about through the years. Nothin' to cheer about yesterday. Today, all gold on the board.

MIKE WEIR: I believed in the guys. Whether it was uh, 3-2, 4-1, 5-0 was obviously a bonus, we just wanted to get ourselves back in this and the guys played unbelievable. They really responded incredibly.

ANNC: This Presidents Cup suddenly has turned into one of the most intriguing weekends we have seen in a while.

ANNC: It was a group effort today. Every single match out was a winner for Captain Mike Weir and we've got a 5-5 tie heading to the weekend.

<u>C1 – SATURDAY FOUR-BALL</u>

ANNC: So, the USA leading five-zip beginning day number two, it was sort of red dawn and very quickly it turned into black Friday.

ANNC: I think that is the challenge today for the International side – can they maintain the intensity that it took to answer getting swept Day 1. The U.S. sort of really wanting to come out and respond.

ANNC: A big Saturday at the Presidents Cup. Two sessions beginning with four four-ball matches, followed by four foursomes matches this afternoon.

WITH THE PRESIDENTS CUP NOW TIED AT FIVE ALL, TOM AND SI WOO KIM CONTINUE THE INTERNATIONAL MOMENTUM AGAINST KEEGAN BRADLEY AND WYNDHAM CLARK ON HOLE TWO ...

ANNC: Really good opportunity here for the Internationals to go 2UP ... this is not a team you want to get going because they are like a freight train ... Yeah! Uppercut, followed by a hook!

AS DO HIDEKI MATSUYAMA AND SUNGJAE IM AGAINST SAM BURNS AND PATRICK CANTLAY ...

ANNC: Drips it in, early gold on the board here. Excellent start for the Internationals.

THE AMERICANS, HOWEVER, QUICKLY PUT THE BRAKES ON THE BLACK AND GOLD ...

ANNC: Burns birdie putt at the 6th to win the hole ... beautiful roll, get the Americans headed in the right direction here!

ANNC: Xander Schaffuele to win the hole at the 9th... here come your Americans!

ANNC: Very gettable shot here for Collin, back into the wind, looking for the spin ... that was a beautiful shot! That was fantastic. So now, the United States is up in three of their four matches.

TOM KIM'S PUTTER STAYS HOT ON HOLE 10 AS THE KIMS HOLD STRONG FOR THE SHIELD ...

ANNC: Birdie putt to win the hole – this would get them back to 3UP, they were 3UP after the 8^{th} , Wyndham Clark birdied the 9^{th} – spike the noise meter once again!

WHILE ADAM SCOTT AND TAYLOR PENDRITH PULL EVEN WITH SCOTTIE SCHEFFLER AND COLLIN MORIKAWA THRU 14 ...

ANNC: For birdie ... is it? Yes Adam Scott! What a putt!

BUT SCHEFFLER RESPONDS WITH BACK-TO-BACK BIRDIES, AND FLIPS THE MOMENTUM IN FAVOR OF THE AMERICANS ...

ANNC: This is to finish it...and that's what number one in the world does! First point on the board for the red, white and blue!

ANNC: Par putt to win the match, Xander Schauffele ... here goes! Another point on the board for the United States and a 3&2 win over the Canadian duo.

ANNC: Matsuyama has to make it ... and that'll do it. 2&1 victory for Cantlay and Burns. The U.S. with a statement in the first session on this Saturday.

WITH THREE POINTS ON THE BOARD FOR THE U.S., IT'S UP TO THE KIMS TO PREVENT ANOTHER SESSION SWEEP ...

ANNC: Two birdie putts for the Internationals here at the 15th to close out the match ... oh! Take the hat off! Second day in a row Siwoo Kim puts away an American duo! Yeah, they have just played beautiful golf, and so entertaining.

SI WOO KIM: Yeah, I played good, and then what can I say, Tom Him.

ANNC: After two days where both teams swept, the U.S. comes out with an 8-6 lead heading into the final team session. It's the most dominant four-ball performance in Presidents Cup history, 8-1.

THE U.S. TEAM REGAIN CONTROL OF THE PRESIDENTS CUP, BUT THE KOREANS CONTROL THE ENERGY, AND BOTH TOM AND SIWOO KIM HOPE THEIR INTENSITY CAN SPUR ANOTHER COMEBACK FOR THE INTERNATIONALS ...

<u>C2 – KOREAN PASSION AND INTENSITY</u>

XANDER SCHAUFFELE: I have a lot of respect for everyone on that team but the Koreans definitely bring the heat, no doubt.

THE 20-24 INTERNATIONAL TEAM BOASTS A RECORD-TYING FOUR KOREAN PLAYERS; ALL OF WHOM BRING THE PASSION NEEDED TO GET *THEIR HOME* CANADIAN CROWDS GOING ...

BEN AN: I don't show much emotions when I play golf other weeks, but I just feel like some emotions kind of pop in a little bit more during this Presidents Cup week.

TOM KIM: You know, I feel like momentum shifts can really happen really quickly. We're definitely going to use our crowds and our fans to our advantage

SI WOO KIM: I'm not just playing for myself, I'm playing for the team and for Korea. This tournament is special because of that added responsibility. If I play well, I'll do my best to hype up the home crowd and fans.

THOUGH THE KOREANS BRING A CERTAIN INTENSITY, THEY ALSO SHARE A PLAYFUL ENERGY WITH EACH OTHER THAT EXTENDS TO THE REST OF THE TEAM.

TOM KIM: We all kind of get along and we all kind of laugh so we have a good time.

SI WOO KIM: Because there's four Koreans on the team, the team chemistry is unique. Especially between us Koreans, the joking around and having fun together makes this Presidents Cup a special experience.

<u>C3 – SATURDAY FOURSOMES</u>

ANNC: The four foursomes matches this afternoon have been confirmed ... the Internationals are going with the same eight players for each session today.

RIDING THE MOMENTUM PROVIDED BY THE KIMS ON SATURDAY MORNING, ADAM SCOTT AND TAYLOR PENDRITH TAKE AN EARLY LEAD OVER BRIAN HARMAN AND MAX HOMA ...

ANNC: Confidence builder right there! The Internationals 1UP early!

AND THE CANADIAN TANDEM OF COREY CONNERS AND MACKENZIE HUGHES FOLLOW SUIT ...

ANNC: Wow, what a start for that team! 2UP, three birdies, three holes played!

BUT SAM BURNS AND COLLIN MORIKAWA RESPOND EMPHATICALLY TO THE CANADIANS ...

ANNC: That is four birdies in-a-row now for the Americans, four-straight winning holes. They were 2DN in that match.

WITH THE U.S. LEADING IN THREE MATCHES, THE INTERNATIONALS HOLD STRONG IN THE ANCHOR MATCH ...

ANNC: Sungjae Im reminding the crowd, if you think we're out of it, we never are! And that keeps the 3UP lead for Im and Matsuyama.

WHILE ANOTHER REGAINS THE LEAD ...

ANNC: And there it is. Pendrith and Scott pulling ahead by two with six to go!

AS THE KIMS TIE CANTLAY AND SCHAUFFELE ON HOLE 10 ...

ANNC: Si. Woo. Kim! Back-to-back huge birdies!

THOUGH YET AGAIN, SCHEFFLER HALTS THE INTERNATIONAL MOMENTUM ...

ANNC: Can Scheffler deliver? Yes! And that match tied with six to go.

BUT THE SHIELD PUT UP THE FIRST POINT OF THE AFTERNOON ...

ANNC: Must make ... there it is, hats off. Hats are off. That is a full point, 2UP win for Adam Scott and Taylor Pendrith.

ADAM SCOTT: It was worth it coming out this afternoon to win a point. I'm stoked with that and hopefully, you know, it's gonna be close going into tomorrow. We got a big day.

FOLLOWING THE WIN FROM PENDRITH, CONNERS AND HUGHES TIE THEIR MATCH WITH BURNS AND MORIKAWA ...

ANNC: No more red! Hughes takes care of that!

BUT THE AMERICANS RESPOND AND TALLY THEIR FIRST POINT OF THE AFTERNOON SESSION ...

ANNC: They were 2DN after the first three holes ... and it ends up an American victory at the last!

ALSO OVERCOMING AN EARLY DEFICIT, SCHEFFLER AND HENLEY CONTINUE THE MOMENTUM SHIFT IN FAVOR OF THE U.S.

ANNC: Scheffler and Henley hold off Matsuyama and Im ...

RUSSELL HENLEY: I have the number one player in the world on my team so, we just tried to keep hitting quality shots and I'm just really thankful to get a point.

ANNC: So, after the Internationals took the first point of this final team session, the U.S. is lining up to make it a 3-1 session and a commanding lead heading into tomorrow.

HOLDING A 1UP LEAD THRU 15, CANTLAY AND SCHAUFFELE ARE POSITIONED TO TAKE CONTROL WITH THE KIMS IN TROUBLE ON 16 ...

ANNC: This is right, needs to go on this line! Couple of big misses now. Wow, things suddenly unraveling a bit here for the International side.

ANNC: So, must hole out here...

ANNC: Oh, wow! You're kidding me! Just when you thought they had no chance, they're tied again!

THE FINAL MATCH COMES DOWN TO A PUTT-OFF ON THE FINAL GREEN ...

ANNC: How is this one gonna end? Everybody's here, you've got two birdie putts.

PATRICK CANTLAY: You just have to keep telling yourself to refocus and refocus. / With the team all around, coming up the last hole, it's easy to focus then.

ANNC: The only people making noise is the American side. That was crazy clutch good. And we've seen it so many times from Cantlay!

ANNC: And now it's on the shoulders of Si Woo Kim to see if he can scratch out this tie ... so in the end, it is 11-7.

PATRICK CANTLAY: We faced some incredible golf on the other side in both my matches today. They made a ton of birdies. They got amped up in front of the home crowd. Home crowd loved it. That's great for golf. We just made one more birdie.

ANNC: The U.S. takes a significant, four-point lead into the singles. We'll see you tomorrow for the conclusion of the 15th Presidents Cup with America in control again.

<u>D1 – SUNDAY SINGLES PART 1</u>

ANNC: The Internationals need to win 8.5 points to win the cup. No team on either side has ever done that in the history of the Presidents Cup. The U.S. just 4.5 points away from winning the cup for the 13th time in 15 Presidents Cups. Final day of Sunday Singles.

WITH AN EXCITING SUNDAY AHEAD, THE FIRST MATCH SETS THE TONE ...

ANNC: How 'bout that start from 45 feet for Schauffele!

ANNC: Jason Day now to tie it ... atmosphere has been punctured – can he put the air back in it again ... there's your answer! What a start!

BUT CAPTAIN FURYK'S TOP-HEAVY LINEUP TAKE EARLY LEADS ...

ANNC: Scheffler from the bunker here, Smylie. This is not a very difficult shot for Scottie. He's thinking about making this for sure ... oh! How 'bout slam dunking it! Scheffler takes the opening hole. Two early red spots up on the board for the U.S. ... what a start for the Americans.

ANNC: Henley for birdie to win the hole against Im ... Russell grabs his first winning hole. Three American red shades up there on the board early.

AND THE AMERICANS PILE ON WITH LONG PUTTS ON THE PAR 3, 5TH...

ANNC: Xander Schauffele to win the hole on Jason Day ... boy oh boy oh boy, has he holed some footage already!

ANNC: Sam Burns looks this one over ... oh good pace, oh wow is that gonna go down!? Geez! How 'bout these long-range putts today! So Burns ups the lead. 2UP thru five.

ANNC: Jim Furyk sent a message today, Brad. He has frontloaded his lineup and he's got red on the board early.

ANNC: Keegan Bradley at the second ... oh, wow! What a start for Keegan Bradley! Goes birdie-birdie.

ANNC: This has been really impressive from America. Their biggest opponent today is themselves and they all look to be completely tuned in and engaged.

THE UNITED STATES TEAM LEADS IN FIVE OF THE FIRST SIX MATCHES, WITH THE LARGEST FOR XANDER SCHAUFFELE AT 3UP, WHO SETS THE PACE FOR THE AMERICANS BOTH ON AND OFF THE COURSE.

<u> D2 – XANDER SCHAUFFELE – VOCAL LEADER</u>

JIM FURYK: I think Xander actually is ready to step up. He's kind of the voice.

RANKED SECOND IN THE WORLD, XANDER SCHAUFFELE'S ELITE TALENT HAS EARNED HIM A THIRD-STRAIGHT SPOT ON THE UNITED STATES PRESIDENTS CUP TEAM ... BUT IT'S WHAT HE BRINGS OFF THE COURSE THAT MAKES HIM ONE OF THE U.S. TEAM'S LEADERS ...

XANDER SCHAUFFELE: You're in a team room and you're there to be a good teammate and I feel like it's important to kind of get the team feeling cohesive and for me at least, getting everyone to laugh a little bit, getting everyone sort of feeling light on their feet.

JIM FURYK: That's kind of his personality. He feels like he plays well when he's loose. His job is, in his mind is to kind of keep the team loose because he thinks they'll play well.

XANDER SCHAUFFELE: I think mentally it's important to get in the right frame of mind. It's not yourself. You know, you are not alone.

ANNC: Schauffele, Finau, you know, they were in control the entire day.

TONY FINAU: It's a different atmosphere out here, but I love the challenge of the emotions. Just staying positive no matter what, and when you got a partner like Xander, it's a lot of fun out there no question.

PATRICK CANTLAY: He's definitely himself; he doesn't change. And he allows me to be myself and doesn't expect me to change. He's got a real serious side on the golf course where he gets locked in, but he also has a, a very fun side and that really comes out in the locker room. And the way he interacts with guys, it's fun to see.

XANDER SCHAUFFELE: Everyone knows how to compete when it's really hard, but when you're in a room with a group of guys you're normally competing against, you kind of let that go because we're all in this together and it's some of the most fun I've ever had. So, I'm pulling for all the guys that I'm in that locker room with.

<u>D3 – SUNDAY SINGLES PART 2</u>

OFF TO A SMOKING HOT START ON SUNDAY, SCHAUFFELE HAS A PUTT TO WIN HIS FIFTH-STRAIGHT HOLE TO FINISH THE FRONT NINE ...

ANNC: Schauffele could apply even more pressure here, and he will. 5UP lead.

WITH A COMMANDING LEAD IN THE FIRST MATCH, MAX HOMA ADDS ANOTHER RED FLAG ON THE BOARD IN THE 12TH MATCH ...

ANNC: Back to the first for Homa to answer Hughes ... oh! Max! Homa! How's your start! Max Homa holes it out for eagle from 103 yards!

ANNC: The Internationals needing to turn things around here. They need 8.5 of the 12 points available on this final Sunday Singles day.

RIGHT ON CUE, HIDEKI MATSUYAMA IGNITES A SPARK IN THE THIRD MATCH ...

ANNC: Oh! There you go. Well done Hideki! What do you know, we've got some more gold on the board! Hideki with a nice little comeback here on Scheffler. So, you do say there's a chance.

AND SI WOO KIM ADDS ANOTHER INTERNATIONAL LEAD IN THE SIXTH MATCH ...

ANNC: To win the hole, grab the 1UP lead on Keegan Bradley ... Siwoo Kim back in front!

WITH SOME MOMENTUM IN THE FRONT OF THE PACK, THE BACK HALF OF THE INTERNATIONAL LINEUP FOLLOWS SUIT ...

ANNC: That, from short range, for Adam Scott. Another gold shade goes on the board!

WITH ALL 12 MATCHES ON THE COURSE, THE INTERNATIONAL TEAM LEADS IN SIX OF THEM, WITH FIVE BEING IN THE FINAL SEVEN ...

ANNC: Something to cheer about for the International side! Crawling, they're crawling. Baby steps.

WHILE THE AMERICANS LEAD IN FIVE MATCHES ... AND NEED ONLY 4-AND-A-HALF POINTS TO SECURE THE CUP ...

ANNC: Players at the top of the order are doing exactly what the instruction would have been from the captain going out.

ANNC: Weir needs some turns here in these matches. Big time.

<u>E1 – SUNDAY SINGLES PART 3</u>

ANNC: Five red-shaded spots up there for the Americans; they just need 4.5 points to win the cup again.

WITH THE AMERICANS POSITIONED TO CONTROL THEIR OWN DESTINY, XANDER SCHAUFFELE ... PUTS THE UNITED STATES ONE STEP CLOSER TO THE FINISH LINE ...

ANNC: First point of the Sunday goes to the Americans. Schauffele, 4-1-0 this week, with a decisive 4&3 victory over Jason Day. World number two did his job this week for Jim Furyk. And now the United States just 3.5 points away.

XANDER SCHAUFFELE: My goal was just to set the tone, you know, get red up on that board as early as possible and I was able to do that.

THE WORLD NUMBER TWO INSPIRES WORLD NUMBER ONE ...

ANNC: Scheffler wins the 12th ... that match is tied. Take some gold off the board.

AND MORE OF HIS AMERICAN TEAMMATES BEHIND ...

ANNC: Cantlay now 2UP suddenly with three to play on Taylor Pendrith.

BUT THE INTERNATIONAL TEAM WON'T BACK DOWN ...

ANNC: This is a Tom Kim moment right here, perhaps ... he knows how big this putt is ... did he hit it? Yes he did! Tom Kim ... ties it up! ... What a putt! Brilliant! Absolutely brilliant from Kim!

ANNC: You've got Tom Kim tied with Burns. You've got Scheffler here tied with Matsuyama. If they are able to win these matches, and then after that, you've got some leads by the International team – a 2UP lead by Conners, a 2UP lead by Min Woo Lee, a 2UP lead by Ben An.

YET AGAIN, THE SILENT LEADER OF THE BLACK & GOLD MAKES A STATEMENT ...

ANNC: From 151 ... this is just a smooth little three-quarter swing; right at it ... it is! Birdie for Matsuyama to putt more pressure on Scheffler! Big Momentum now for Matsuyama.

UP AHEAD ON 18, TOM KIM HAS A CHANCE TO PUT THE FIRST INTERNATIONAL POINT ON THE BOARD ...

ANNC: This guy loves the big stage and this is a huge one right now. Another long one to win it for Kim ... and what a match it was! First tied match of the entire week. So, the U.S. just three points away.

FOLLOWING A HALF POINT FROM TOM KIM, HIDEKI MATSUYAMA DELIVERS A FULL POINT FOR THE SHIELD ...

ANNC: Matsuyama finishes it off! Another good, entertaining match between world number one and number seven. This one goes to Hideki!

BUT TWO AMERICANS FINISH MATCHES IN THEIR FAVOR ...

ANNC: Russell Henley, 3&2 winner, and he just put the Americans a couple points away. They've got 13.5; the magic number? 15.5.

ANNC: Patrick Cantlay puts it away, 3&1. That's another full point. And the United States is now just a point away at 14.5 total.

ANOTHER MATCH NEARING COMPLETION IS KEEGAN BRADLEY AND SI WOO KIM ... AND THE AMERICAN IS 2UP, WITH A CHANCE TO CLINCH THE CUP ON THE PAR 3, 17^{TH} ...

ANNC: Not yet.

BUT LEAVES A GLIMMER OF HOPE FOR THE INTERNATIONALS ...

ANNC: Siwoo Kim knows he's gotta make this ... and he does!

ANNC: What a battle back by the Korean, Siwoo Kim. 3DN with three to play. Now he's trying to grab this half point for his side in unlikely fashion.

BRADLEY STILL HOLDS A 1UP LEAD PLAYING THE 18TH HOLE ... TRYING HIS BEST TO AUTHOR A POSITIVE, FINAL CHAPTER IN THE WHIRLWIND JOURNEY HE'S WRITTEN TO GET HERE.

<u>E2 – KEEGAN BRADLEY – WHIRLWIND JOURNEY</u>

KEEGAN BRADLEY: It's always a goal at the start of the year to either make the Ryder Cup or the Presidents Cup team and not making the Ryder Cup last year was a, was a huge bummer.

KEEGAN BRADLEY: When you miss out on a team like that, you can use it as motivation to keep going.

PLAYING WITH AS MUCH PURPOSE AS EVER BEFORE, BRADLEY RECORDED TWO RUNNER-UP FINISHES IN THE FIRST FIVE MONTHS OF THE SEASON ...

ANNC: Perfect angle; and this is tracking ... sensational! That was one of the best shots we've seen.

BUT BETTER THAN ANY SPOT ON THE LEADERBOARD, BRADLEY WAS NAMED CAPTAIN FOR THE 20-25 U.S. RYDER CUP TEAM AND ASSISTANT CAPTAIN FOR JIM FURYK IN THE 20-24 PRESIDENTS CUP ...

KEEGAN BRADLEY: It's not something, when I first came out on TOUR, I ever thought I'd get the opportunity to do - to be a vice captain, let alone a captain - but it means a lot to me that my peers think that of me to be in that role.

STILL, KEEGAN HAD HIS EYE ON MAKING THE PRESIDENTS CUP TEAM AS A PLAYER ...

KEEGAN BRADLEY: You got to go out there and really prove that you're good enough and worthy enough to be on the team. So, I got a great opportunity here the next handful of weeks to make this team and play.

ANNC: Keegan Bradley takes the BMW again!

KEEGAN BRADLEY: Oh man, it just shows why you gotta grind it out every week because you never know how fast it just can switch.

JIM FURYK: You look at Keegan Bradley, a guy that came up in big moments here at the end of the season, that's what you want on your Presidents Cup team.

KEEGAN BRADLEY: To get the second call to play is even better. A player is what I am first and this is what I wanted to do from the start of the year. I am relishing every moment that I have.

<u>E3 – SUNDAY SINGLES PART 4</u>

GRASPING ONTO A 1UP LEAD, BRADLEY STARES DOWN A LENGTHY BIRDIE PUTT TO FINISH THE MATCH ...

ANNC: Another chance here to win the Presidents Cup ... oh, that's a nice effort there.

ANNC: Siwoo Kim, can he win three-in-a-row here to prevent Keegan from being the cup clincher ... and that will do it! In the end it is Keegan Bradley ... who has the decisive last point to win the Presidents Cup!

ANNC: He's come a long way since that ... bitter disappointment of not being a part of that Ryder Cup team last year. Wow, have things changed for Keegan Bradley!

KEEGAN BRADLEY: I'm uh, wow, that was incredible. I-I kept saying all week I didn't know if I'd ever get to do this again. And to be able to just play in this tournament and then to win the point, my goodness. The last time I played I was the point to lose the Ryder Cup. So, uh, if this is my last round as a player – maybe it is – I'm happy with that.

ANNC: Of all the guys that would get the cup clincher ... I mean, it just adds up, right place, right time for Keegan. Yup, sometimes destiny just writes the script.

<u>E4 – TEAM CELEBRATIONS</u>

ANNC: Jim Furyk puts away the 10th consecutive Presidents Cup victory for the U.S. The second most by any American team in international team match play period. That's how dominant this American side has been in the Presidents Cup.

JIM FURYK: I give the other team a lot of credit for the fight, but I'd go to battle with these 12 guys any time. Very tough, strong minded, unflappable, don't get frazzled.

MIKE WEIR: I just love these guys. I love their fight. What I saw out there today – all week – they battled right to the end. And that's all you can ask as, from the captain.

ADAM SCOTT: There's been an evolution under this shield the last two cups and buy in from International players. Hopefully this competition inspires all of us sitting up here to play really hard, go on with our careers the next two years, win big events and come back better prepared and ready to win in Chicago.

NATS: Let's hear it for Jim Furyk and the victorious United States Presidents Cup Team!

SCOTTIE SCHEFFLER: I think these weeks are a lot of fun. This is one of the great joys of my career is coming out here in these team events and playing.

TONY FINAU: In the wise words of Travis Kelce, you got to fight ... for your right ...

ALL: To party!

CARA BANKS: Now, let's get to the real business. You holed out on the first hole, Kisner said on Twitter, if you did that at the Presidents Cup, then he has something to show you. So, what was it?

MAX HOMA: Tarps off if I holed out. That shirt will be coming off at some point tonight.
